

Terms and Conditions

Entrants

- The competition is open to all community groups or representative from a designated community group from around the UK.
- The competition is limited to one entry per community group. The work must have been completed after September 3rd 2016. No work previously submitted for any other competition is eligible.
- **Entry forms and entries must be submitted by October 22nd 2016**
- All correspondence with entrees will be via email
- Winners will be notified if their work is successful in November 2016
- The copyright for all entries will remain the property of the winning community group, but it is a condition of entry that the community group or their representatives agree unconditionally that Joju may reproduce any selected works, free of charge, for the purposes of marketing, promotion, merchandise, discussion and education in direct connection with Joju, in all media worldwide including the Joju Website, social media feeds, publications, posters, prints, postcards, the Internet and within television documentaries, and may license these specific, limited rights to others only for the same purposes. Joju also reserves the right to reproduce selected images free of charge for core non-commercial purposes
- Entrants are encouraged to submit entries digitally.
- In accordance with the Data Protection Act, 1998, Joju will hold the personal data supplied on the entry form securely. It will only be used in the process of administering the Award, and will not be transferred to any third party. At the close of the Award, it will be retained permanently for historical research purposes. (in accordance with Part IV, 33 of the Act).
- Those not eligible for entry are employees of Joju and their agents.
- The winning entrant will be required to assign the copyright of their entry to Joju
- The decision of the judges is final and no correspondence can be entered into. Entrants should be aware that all works are judged on an equal and anonymous basis and that there is no segregated judging by region or country.
- Joju reserves the right to disqualify any piece of work if the Entrant has not adhered to the rules.

Entries

- The pieces entered can be either a visual or written piece with the title 'Just Add Sunshine' to convey how your community group adds sunshine to people's lives.
- Entries will be judged anonymously so should not be signed on the front if artwork.
- Artwork should be no larger than A1 in size. It is recommended that all entries are submitted in pdf format digitally **but they can be posted. Postal entries must be postmarked before October 22nd 2016.**

DIGITAL SUBMISSION OF WORK

- It is a requirement that each entrant should upload an image of their work, if a visual piece or upload as a Word or PDF file if a written piece when registering for the competition
- Please ensure that the photographs uploaded by the artist of visual work is of high quality.

THE AWARDS

First Prize:

- In 2013 Joju built a Solar PV system at 43 Grafton Way, London and we were assigned the FiT payments from this building. It generates approximately 1000/kWh/year . Being installed when subsidies were at their most generous, it currently receives a FiT payment of 49p/kWh which equates to £500/year. By re-assigning the FiT. The system can receive the feed-in tariff for the next 21 years, and its index linked. Ownership of the array will pass to the winning community group.
- The reassignment of the FiT must be awarded and subsequently owned by a community group and no one individual.
- Once ownership has passed to the winning community group a relationship will be created by Joju with the residential manager of 43 Grafton Way, London and it will become the group's responsibility to work with the residential manager to monitor the array and claim the FiT each year. Joju will act as a liaison where necessary between parties.]
- There is no cash prize alternative

Second Prize:

- Joju will work with the winning community group to create an LED project equivalent to £500 in value. This could take the form of a Halogen light amnesty but other projects are possible. The value of the prize will be in work and LED lighting.
